#### 1 Welcome and Apologies

The chair welcomed attendees to the meeting and apologies, as above, were noted.

#### 2 Membership and Terms of Reference [BEC.2015.01]

The Committee noted the terms of reference and membership.

#### 3 New Programme Proposals

There were no proposals for new programmes to consider.

## 4 Major Modifications to Existing Programmes and Changes to Schemes for Award of Honours

There were no proposals for major modifications to existing programmes or changes to schemes for award of honours to consider.

#### 5 Additional Entry Criteria

There were no proposals to amend additional entry criteria to consider.

#### 6 Exchange Partnerships

- 6.1 There were no proposals for new exchange partnerships to consider.
- 6.2 Dr Paolo Taticchi, the School's Director of Global Initiatives briefed the Committee on plans for increasing exchange opportunities for students. The School had formed a Globalisation Task Force 3 years ago which had produced a set of criteria, approved by Management Board, to be applied when considering new alliances and partnerships with other institutions. Exchange agreements had since been put in place with Bocconi, ESC Rennes, ESSEC, HEC, HHL, St Gallen and agreements with FDSM and Rotterdam were currently being processed. The first student exchanges, both incoming and outgoing, were taking place in 2015/16. Outgoing exchanges were available to the MBA and MSc Management programmes and applied to elective modules only. Outgoing exchanges were for short blocks of time rather than for a whole term and agreements were limited to a few students. The School had been approved as a new candidate member of the Partnership in International Management (PIM) Network, a consortium of leading international Business Schools. PIM accepted one new candidate member annually into its network. A condition of membership was to have exchange agreements with 20% of PIM members. The School aimed to have 12 exchange partnerships in place for 25 incoming/outgoing students by the end of 2016. The Committee supported plans to increase the number of exchange partnerships with elite business schools.
- 6.3 The Committee reviewed the list of electives that were being offered to incoming students. It was agreed that this list should be reviewed with Programme Teams to ensure that all available electives were included.

#### 7 Survey Results

#### 7.1 Undergraduate SOLE Survey Results [BEC.2015.02]

The Committee considered the results of the undergraduate autumn term 2015 SOLE and MODES lecturer and module surveys. The Committee noted that the teaching scores were pleasing but concern was expressed about low response rates. It was commented that the response rates in the Business School were slightly better than those in other departments in the College. In departments where higher response rates were observed this was normally because sessions were scheduled with students specifically for survey completion and individuals who had not completed the survey were individually followed up. The Business School had tried various approaches to encourage participation. It was commented that it was important for the School to provide a response to student feedback so that students could see that it had an effect. It was suggested that perhaps publishing anonymous teaching scores to the Staff & Student Committee might prove worthwhile. This would be given further consideration outside of the meeting.

The Committee considered the proposal regarding the conduct of oral examinations from the Assessment Task and Finish Group. The School made limited use of vivas but extensive use of presentations in the assessment of students. The School also assessed class participation although it was noted that this was regarded as 'practical' rather than 'oral' assessment. It was the view of the Committee that the new regulations should explain what was meant by oral assessment and give examples of the forms of assessment that this might include. It was agreed, however, that the regulations should not prescribe what forms of oral assessment may be used for a particular award. The School's representatives on the Assessment Task and Finish Group would pass on this feedback.
