An Industrial Placement is a compulsory part of both our four year MEng Computing and our four year MEng in Mathematics & Computer Science degree programmes. The Placement takes place in the student's penultimate year (third year of a four year degree). Recruiting students on an Industrial Placement is one of the most effective ways of attracting world-class candidates

6 Months


For the MEng Computing students the Industrial Placement is six months in duration running from the first week in April to the end of September.

3-4 Months

MEng Mathematics and Computer Science students complete a four month placement running from the first week in June to the end of September.

Timeline

The best time to advertise Industrial Placement opportunities is at the beginning of the Autumn term for opportunities starting the following year. In order to have access to a wider range of candidates, you are advised to advertise as early as possible, preferably having the job or project specification available the first week in October. The application process starts the first week of the Academic year in October.



Placements key information:

- ⇒ **Paid** - Placements should be paid
Ask for recommend or competitive salaries
- ⇒ **Visited** - The student's personal tutor will visit the student whilst on the placement to ensure work is appropriate
- ⇒ **Assessed** - Students are required to submit an executive summary and deliver a presentation. Company representatives are invited to attend to support their student
- ⇒ **Work Permits** - As the Industrial Placement is a compulsory part of the degree programme, overseas students do not require a work permit to undertake an Industrial Placement. We can provide appropriate documentation to confirm this
- ⇒ **Company Assessment**
Assessment of the student's contributions and achievements by a company supervisor during the Placement is also desirable
- ⇒ **Confidentiality Concerns**
In order to assess our students we recommend that the company should resolve any confidentiality concerns regarding the executive summary and the presentation before the Placement begins. The company can ask the student to get his/ her coursework approved by an internal manager in charge of the project or the IP Department. This practice would enable the company to remove any commercially sensitive material and give the student a fair chance of assessment

Speed Interview Event

The search for an Industrial Placement search has been can be time consuming and difficult for students to juggle with their degree. To ease this, we run a Speed Interview event, where students can undertake the initial screening interview quickly and in bulk.

There is no charge to take part, although Corporate Partners will be prioritised.

Employers will have 6 minutes with a student, to access their suitability for their placement. They will be provided the chance to indicate which students they would like to move to the next stage of the application. i.e. code challenge, 2nd interview, technical interview. A CV book will also be provided.

- Recruiters , hiring managers, or technical managers. Whoever does the initial interview.
