

Guidance for students on what to expect from an in-person Graduate School workshop and what we expect from you

This document provides guidance on what to expect from an in-person Graduate School workshop and what the School expects from you to enable the creation of a safe teaching environment for all.

Please read this document before signing up to an in-person workshop so that you understand how our in-person workshops will be delivered. You will then be able to make an informed decision about whether to attend an in-person or remote workshop.

Vaccinations and testing

The College is very strongly encouraging vaccination, including boosters.

You are encouraged to take regular COVID tests before coming into campus and to report the results. PCR results should be reported using the [self-declaration form](#) and [MyImperial](#) for LFD tests.

The College's current position is that it will continue to offer on-site [asymptomatic PCR testing for all staff and students](#).

The government's LFD Collect scheme has now come to an end, and from 17.00 on Friday 25 February the College is no longer able to distribute LFD tests on campus. Staff and students can [order LFD tests free-of-charge from the Gov.uk website](#) until 1 April 2022.

To help control the spread of respiratory infections within the College and to keep our community safe, anyone showing symptoms should not attend campus.

Use of hand sanitiser and wipes

Where hand sanitiser is available for use in a Graduate School workshop, you are encouraged to use it.



Social distancing

Although the rules around social distancing have been relaxed, our tutors have been advised to deliver their course at a distance of at least 2 meters from you.

Face coverings

You should continue wearing face coverings in most indoor settings on campus, including teaching spaces **and for Graduate School workshops.**

Contact Tracing

As part of the government's plan, routine contact tracing ends on 24 February 2022. For the remainder of this term, Imperial's [COVID-19 Contact Tracing Hub](#) will continue to provide support and advice to staff and students regarding the management of COVID.
